PSR PROGRAM 2023 – 2024

Our PSR program is held at St. Mark parish on Monday evenings from 6:30 - 7:30 in the school building. We serve students in Grades 1 - 8. Students in grades 2 and 8 are prepared to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Eucharist (grade 2) and Confirmation (Grade 8), as part of our curriculum. For a student to receive these Sacraments they MUST be enrolled and attend PSR the previous year. You can register in several different ways for the 2023 – 2024 school year:

Registration is due with payment by June 4, 2023.

- 1. Current PSR families will receive a packet with the registration materials. The packet will be sent home with your child.
- 2. The materials can be downloaded from the St. Mark website: www.stmarkcleveland.com, under heading FAMILIES (at the top of the page) and by clicking the PSR tab.
- 3. Registration materials can also be picked up at the St. Mark Parish Office.

TAKE GOOD CARE OF YOURSELF. YOU BE-LONG TO GOD



Taking care of ourselves can become a low priority in the midst of other obligations. Yet caring for our bodies and minds is a duty we have to God. He needs us strong and healthy so we can help build up His kingdom.

Body: What you put into your body is even more important than what you put on it. Take steps to make your diet

Evidence shows that it's hard to regularly watch violent shows or movies and still be a calm and happy person. Programs or movies that portray infidelity or promiscuity as acceptable behaviors eventually dull our sense of sin. Feed your mind positive, Gospel-centered images that will build you up and inspire you. Surround yourself with people who do the same.

WHAT IS THE MEANING OF THE MIRACULOUS MEDAL



The Miraculous Medal, given to St. Catherine Labouré in 1830, was designed by the Blessed Mother to teach us three things: **Mary prays for us:** The medal's front reads: *O Mary, conceived without sin, pray* for us who have recourse to thee. We don't

pray to her; she prays for us! Of course, we can go directly to Jesus anytime. In fact, Mary's role is to bring us to Jesus as swiftly and safely as possible. **Evil can be defeated:** Mary is shown crushing Satan's head, recalling the prophecy of his defeat (Genesis 3:15). Mary's humble "yes" to God paved the way for Christ's victory over death, sin, and evil. When we give God our "yes," then Christ's victory bears fruit in our lives.

Grace is always available: St. Catherine asked why only some of the gemstones in Mary's rings radiated light. Her answer? The dim gems symbolize "the graces for which souls forget to ask." God's grace is always available to us. All we have to do is ask.


